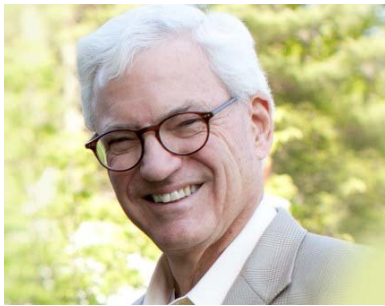

R. Judson Carlberg (M.Div., 1965)

Dr. Jud Carlberg passed away on November 20, 2014 after a battle with cancer. He was 74 years old. Dr. Carlberg served at Gordon College for 35 years, first as Dean of Faculty, two years as vice president of development and twenty years as the President.

Not only was he an Alumnus of Denver Seminary but he served on the Board of Trustees from 1990 to 2013. Denver Seminary President Mark Young said of Carlberg “There was little doubt that Jud’s voice was the most respected in the room, a status well-deserved. But there was an undercurrent of safety in his razor-focused questions and perfectly placed pearls of wisdom. Jud willed me to trust him by the sheer strength of his person. And I did. I trusted him to do what was right and noble and above reproach.”

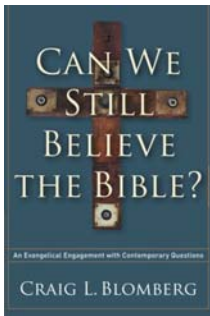


Community Christmas Gathering.
