The day after Commencement 2016, I left for Israel with my best friend, also a Den. Sem. alumna, and a fabulous group of students, alumni, faculty, board members and friends. We walked not quite non-stop for three weeks. We learned about the geography, geology and topography of the Holy Land, but mostly we walked. We walked where OT and NT heroes and villains walked; we walked where Jesus walked. There really isn't anything to which I want to compare sharing that space with Jesus, even millennia later.

The Judean wilderness is still stark; Herod's building projects, impressive; Peter's house, tiny; and the Temple mount, heart breaking for oh so many reasons. One of my favorite places is the Sea of Galilee simply because I know Jesus spent time in that same water. I love to watch the sun set over Tiberias and imagine Jesus doing the same – with prayer, with yearning, with a touch of sorrow.

Some of you have been to Israel and have your own memories. Some of you have been planning to go for years. Please, let me encourage that second group to seriously consider going. A trip to Israel may, dare I say should, change the way you think about the Bible. There is something about going through Samaria, up to Jerusalem, or down to Capernaum that puts living flesh on the bones of our Bible knowledge. Being there really does make a difference, frequently a life-changing difference. Being there with brothers and sisters in Christ, perhaps Denver Seminary alumni, is icing on an already rich cake.


Alumni Scholarship Fund



Some important faculty announcements from Educational Programs and Services:

Dr. Bill Klein moved to part time faculty status effective July 1. He will continue to teach approximately 9 credit hours per academic year in the New Testament Department.

Dr. Janelle Hallman is taking the Academic Year, 2016 – 17, off from full time faculty teaching, and will be working part time in the Counseling Division, providing professional oversight and expertise.
